Guideline Itinerary:-

Monday: We head for Heysham to catch the Isle of Man ferry with a stop on the way for refreshments.

Tuesday: We start the day with a visit to Port Erin, an Edwardian resort with a beautiful bay sheltered by Bradda Head. We then head towards the Calf of Man and on to Castletown where the medieval Castle Rushen dominates the town and harbour.

Wednesday: This morning we head to the fishing port of Peel with it's ruined castle overlooking the harbour, then continue on to the village of St. John's, the setting of an annual open air Manx Parliament on Tynwald Hill. In the afternoon we make our way to Douglas with it's beautiful bay and terraced seafront buildings, returning to Ramsey by the Mountain Road that's a thrilling section of the TT motorcycling circuit.

Thursday: We head to the historic mining village of Laxey, famous for the 'Lady Isabella' – the largest working waterwheel of its kind in the world, and there will be time for an optional trip on the mountain railway to the scenic summit of Snaefell (optional Snaefell Mountain Railway group rate approximately £15 per person).

Friday: We depart for our return ferry crossing and head for home with a lunch 7top on the way.

The cost is £599 for members and £609 for non-members and there's a single supplement of £20 per night.
