9th Sept: Today we head to Sheringham, a busy little resort with a fine sandy beach. We enjoy a journey on the Poppy Line, steaming through unspoilt countryside with stunning coastal views on 1 of the 5 greatest heritage lines in the UK, finishing at the smart Georgian town of Holt one of the most attractive in north Norfolk, for free time to take in it's fine 18th century Georgian buildings, art galleries, antique and book shops and places to eat located along the high street and tucked away in hidden, charming courtyards and alleyways.

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10th Sept: This morning we head into the Norfolk Broads to take a leisurely cruise aboard the Southern Comfort, a Mississippi Paddle Steamer. We cruise along the River Bure to reach Ranworth Broad, passing lovely old, thatched houses, windmills and Norfolk reed beds. Throughout the trip there is excellent commentary. This afternoon we make our way into the 'Fine City' of Norwich. which boasts two cathedrals: a Norman Cathedral with cloisters and a catholic cathedral too! Take a stroll down Elm Hill, a cobbled street with its medieval houses, explore The Lanes with superb independent shops, the colourful marketplace and the 12th century Norman Castle.

11th Sept: Into Suffolk today to visit Southwold with a working lighthouse, beach huts, award-winning pier, cliff top cannon and of course the beach, combine to make Southwold a quintessentially English resort town. The High Street is the perfect location for some retail therapy, alongside cafes and restaurants that serve quality food and washed down with ale brewed at the local Adnams brewery.
